PASSPORT: A valid passport is mandatory.

VISAS: ECOWAS nationals are exempt but is required for most non-residents. For more details consult the Ghana Mission or Consular Office near you or the Ghana Immigration Service.

HEALTH: Yellow fever vaccination is required by all except infants under one year.

**CLOTHING:** Loose, cool clothing is recommended all year round. Dress is conservative in Ghana and long trousers are generally worn.

USEFUL ITEMS: Flashlight is useful. Birdwatchers should carry their own binoculars.

NATIONAL DIALING CODE: +233

**DRIVING:** Ghanaians drives on the right. Visitors require an International Driving Licence and Insurance. Vehicles driven across the borders require a special permit.

**CREDIT CARD FACILITIES & CURRENCY EXCHANGE:** Most international credit cards are accepted. Foreign currency can be exchanged at Forex facilities and banks.

**TIPPING:** The quality of service should dictate your generosity to the waiter, taxi driver, porter, guide etc.

**HOTELS:** Ghana's hotels are classified according to the international star system, from one to five. Budget hotels offer limited service. The grade of a hotel in Ghana is identifiable on a Hotel Licence issued by the Ghana Tourism Authority and is displayed at the hotel reception. Log on to www.visitghana.com

**RESTAURANTS:** There is a wide choice of international restaurants. Visitors can also sample delicious spicy Ghanaian dishes at local restaurants (chop bars). Visit www.visitghana.com

**SHOPPING:** Abundant opportunities exist to shop for souvenirs at craft shops, art galleries, open markets, malls, jewellery shops and craft villages.




Black Star Square

Asafotufiam Festival: First Saturday of August in Ada, Greater Accra

Homowo Festival: August to September in the Greater Accra. Oguaa Fetu Afahye: First Saturday of September in Cape Coast. Odwira festival: September and October in Eastern Region.

Kundum Festival: September in Axim, Western Region.

Hogbetsotso Festival: First Saturday of November in Anloga.

Asogli Festival: First Saturday of November in Ho.

Damba Festival: Celebrated in the Northern Ghana.

Fire (Bugum) Festival: Held by many ethnic groups in the Northern Ghana.
